some important ideas religious ppl are generally better about is: accepting moral truth and free will exist, avoiding moral or cultural relativism, and being skeptical of too much government authority

they more often care about traditional ideas about marriage and how to organize a family, which is good. so much harm has been done by people having inadequate respect for the nuclear family.

it's not perfect but there are a lot more ways to do worse than better

christians better reject socialism than atheists. (jews suck here, tho)

christians are better at seeing man as more important than plants or animals, and rejecting environmentalism

christians are less fooled by the "scientists" seeking authority to tell ppl what to do or think tons of whom are basically frauds

they're more able to resist a pronouncement from a person claiming the authority of science. this is partly related to their ability also to resist pronouncements from religious authorities and think for themselves

and it works with government authority some too. just authority in general.

they're more able to be humble and say they don't know everything and stick to reasonable ideas, common sense, and tradition that hasn't worked out tooooo badly in the past. rather than being like "well that seems logical" and then, knowing nothing, try to act on some new idea they don't know how to think about well, and don't know enough about, but also don't know how to argue against.

lots of ppl today feel super pressured by logical or scientific arguments they don't know how to argue against, and religious traditions help ppl resist that






we are told all the time that someone (usually the speaker or their parent) embodies TCS ideas even though they have never read TCS essays. it is false in 100% of cases.



and in general ppl are much less willing to talk about that.

Robert Spencer (of Jihad Watch – he does good work) pretends to do something like Paths Forward. he talks to critics substantially on twitter. but he's dishonest. there's a trick to it. if you challenge him and he's actually wrong, and it's hard to answer you, he just starts ignoring you – while continuing to reply to the ppl he thinks he can beat.

i think this is interesting b/c what does he gain by this dishonesty? what is he avoided? time very well spent engaging with challenging ideas!

Q&A's like JPs are somewhat similar, but less dishonest about it. it's clearer with what they do that the discussion is rather limited.

(but not fully clear)

i test ppl a lot. it's pretty cheap to say one or two things to someone and see if they react rationally

i tested Spencer recently. he misquoted obama in a blog post. he was active on twitter. i told him. he responded to me once, then started ignoring me and my friends who chimed in – but kept responding to the same hostile idiots he was also talking with.

i dislike obama just as much as spencer, but you gotta get your quotes right

they always have some excuse in their mind when they dismiss challenges

his was that the words he put within quote marks were quotes. which is true. but he took some stuff out of context and then substantially misrepresented it.

he did that thing where you write a statement partly with quotes and partly with paraphrases, and attribute the whole idea to the person quoted

and it was just totally wrong

Which is, (1) Some information was intended by God to be literal, and some to be non-literal. (2) Humans have to interpret what God said, what it means, whether it's literal or not, and they can make errors in doing that.

So while they say there are no errors in the Bible, they say it's easy to make errors reading / interpreting it.

The best example of this was with regard to slavery.

Stuff in the Bible seems to support slavery. Stuff like slaves should obey their masters.

But after slavery became unpopular, their interpretation changed. Now they say God doesn't like slavery, but was instead saying to respect authority (and first of all God's authority). The stuff about slavery was non-literal.

This sort of mental gymnastics gets around lots of what would be patently silly "Bible is 100% true" assertions. They'll say it is true, but not literal.

What's the standard? Mostly culture that's external to the religion.

So while there's cultural pressure on abortion, and gay marriage, they haven't given in on those things.

If cultural pressure becomes cultural consensus, I predict they will give in on those points.
